CLASSICAL AND MODERN CULTURES (CMC)

The major in Classical and Modern Cultures is within the BA Honours degree and requires the completion of 8.00 credits. It is intended for students interested to acquire a solid foundation of the development of culture from classical to modern times. The program pairs a diachronic understanding of cultural practices with in-depth expertise in one of three disciplinary Areas of Emphasis: Classical Studies, Global European Studies, Languages and Linguistics. Classical and Modern Cultures trains students in anti-oppressive practices, with an emphasis on the decolonization and indigenization of culture, institutions and policies, both on a personal and societal level.

One area of emphasis must be declared by the end of semester three.
